



A: Let us pray... Creator God, in your wisdom you bring forth all that is good and the harvest is plentiful.





ABOUT TODAY'S THEME: "O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" Today we celebrate the holy Trinity. Paul writes that through Jesus we have peace with God, whose love pours into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, giving us lasting hope. We celebrate the gracious One-in-Three, eternal Three-in-One, as we worship in community; as we share water and word, bread and wine; and as we bring God's love and hope to our neighbors.

ABOUT TODAY'S LESSONS:

First Lesson: In the Bible, wisdom is portrayed in terms sometimes human and sometimes divine. Often, wisdom is personified as feminine. In this passage, Woman Wisdom is depicted not only as the first creation of God, but also as God's helper, rejoicing in God's creation, especially in human beings.

Second Lesson: Paul describes the life of faith with reference to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Even now, we have peace with God through Jesus, and our hope for the future is grounded in the love of God that we experience through Christ's Holy Spirit.

Gospel Lesson: *Jesus'* ongoing presence with the disciples will be made known through the coming Spirit who will guide them and communicate to them Jesus' will and glory.
